Soon after our June 10th Downeast Day Camp volunteer training (shared about in our previous newsletter), the summer missionaries and I traveled up to Mapleton to help CEF's Northern Maine chapter with their Echo Burst youth training from June 19th-21st. We had a wonderful time helping to train the teens in attendance on sharing the gospel using a fidget tool! The teens were eager to learn, and it was a joy to partner with our Northern Maine staff in equipping the next generation to spread the Good News!

Upon returning to Eastern Maine, we quickly shifted gears to our final preparations for Downeast Day Camp 2023 held from July 10th-13th! What an amazing week the Lord blessed us with! We had fifty-six children attending and three girls accepted Jesus as their Savior that week! Praising the Lord for their decisions to follow Jesus! Many other children responded to the Gospel invitation given each day with questions about what it means to believe in Jesus. Please join us in praying for these children, for the Lord to continue to work in their hearts, that the seeds that were planted will continue to grow and that they will come to place their trust fully in Him. Please pray also for those children who responded who had already placed their trust in Jesus, but desired to learn more and grow deeper in their faith. It was a joyful week, full of Bible stories, memorization of verses, songs, missionary stories, small group devotions, games, activities, team challenges, and so much more! The smiles on the children's faces each day and the laughter that could be heard throughout the camp warmed my heart and was just a glimpse of the goodness of our Lord who enabled Downeast Day Camp to happen again this year! In addition to our CEF of Eastern Maine summer staff, we had thirty-one volunteers serving at day camp, ranging in age from young teens to older adults! We also had a crew of adults and teens who helped with set up and tear down before and after Downeast Day Camp week! The Lord provided a wonderful couple who gifted a beautiful huge tent to CEF of Eastern Maine! This tent allowed us to have our Bible times and activities in the big field shaded from the hot sun! It allowed our campers and staff to be able to focus on God's Word in a pleasant and cooler space! In addition, our CEF of Northern Maine staff came to help for the week and God provided a kind and generous sister in Christ who opened her home to host them for the week that they served with us! What a blessing our team of volunteers were to us! God is so good to send all of them to us! In Matthew 9:37-38 Jesus says to His disciples, "The harvest truly is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest." The Lord answered our prayers! We are so thankful for all of you who have prayed alongside us for Downeast Day Camp to be able to happen again this year!
